The commodification of transness has been an issue in the community for years. One of the first examples of this is a trans woman named Christine Jorgensen. She was the first American to undergo gender affirming surgery. She was an army veteran but after her medical transition, she was unable to find work outside of commodifying herself. American society made a spectacle of her and her "persona" making it very difficult for her to find work. The social stigma and publicity made self-promotion her only option for income.






