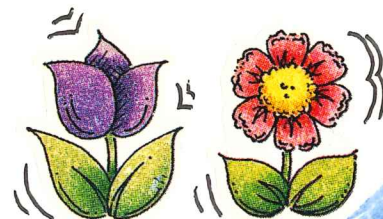

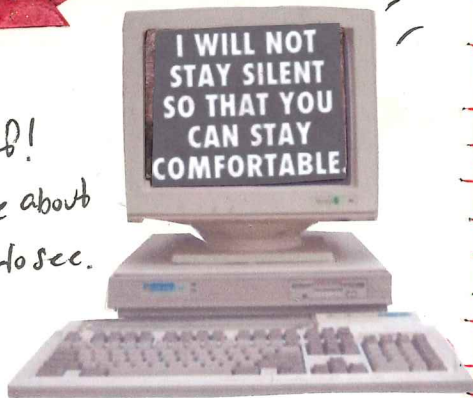

WAYS TO PROTEST

Public demonstrations like marches, rallies, and sit-ins are one of the most visible ways to support a cause. These usually involve a group of people using their right to public assembly and are usually events that support a specific cause or multiple similar ones. Historically, protests such as the civil rights sit-ins, and more recent ones like BLM or Black Lives Matter rallies, have shown how powerful community action can be.

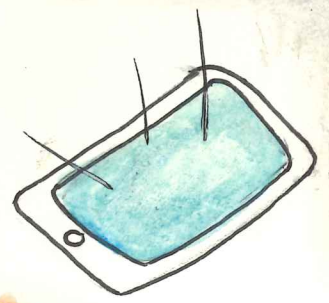
- UnSafe environments

you can also protest online using social media or other platforms, and you can also educate others by sharing your cause and expressing support. this can help spark change in hard to reach places



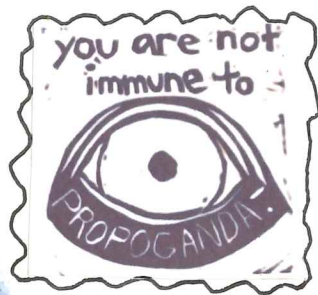
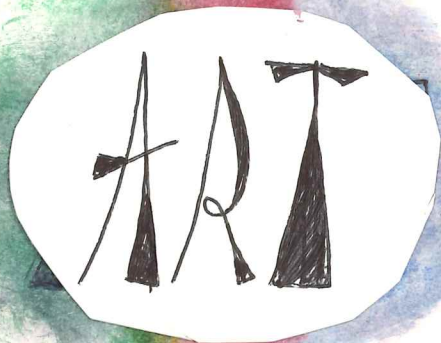
You can wear clothing or accessories like shirts, pins, or anything with a message that reflects your cause

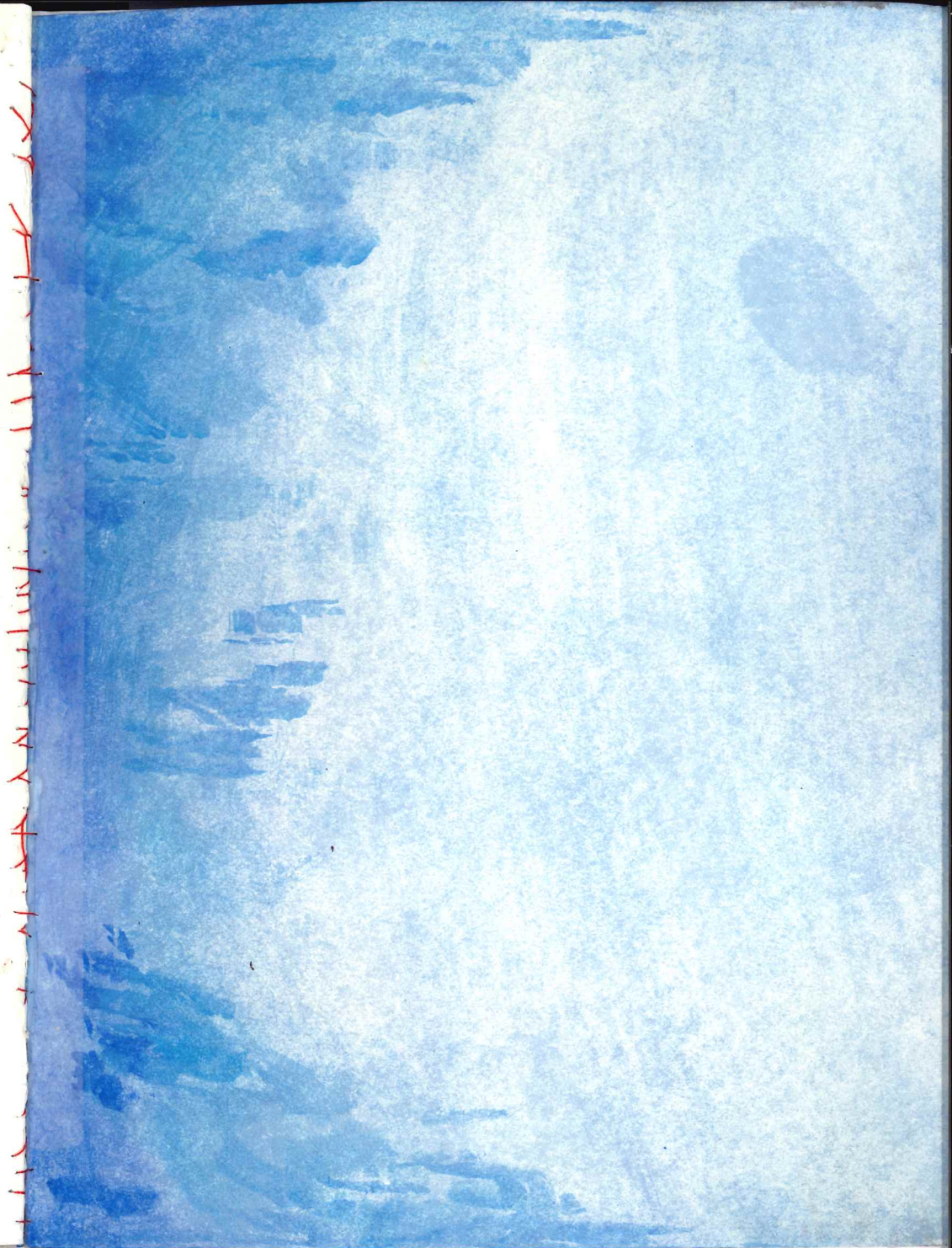
Why is this Important?
