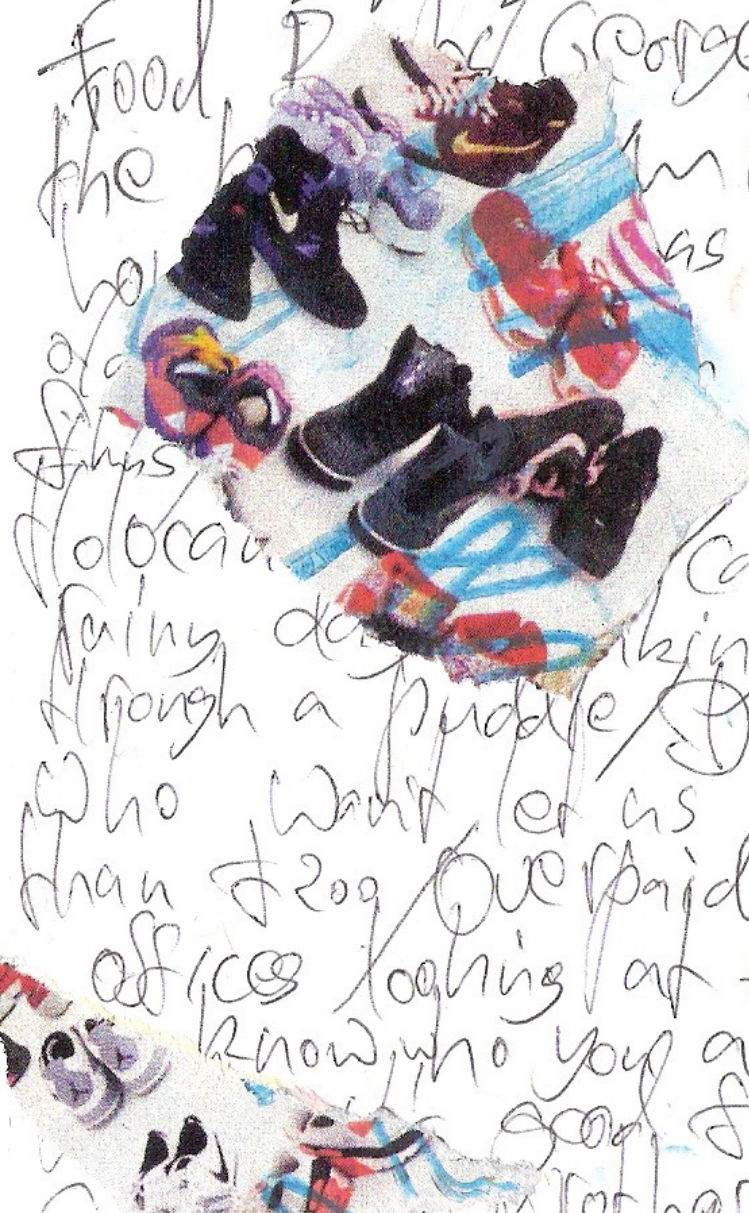

### bloody

The taboo against bloody came about with the Victorian's linguistic prudery but its actual origins are not known... A 'minced oath' of By My Lady? From the destruction wrought by blue blooded nobility in the 15<sup>th</sup> century Wars of the Roses?
