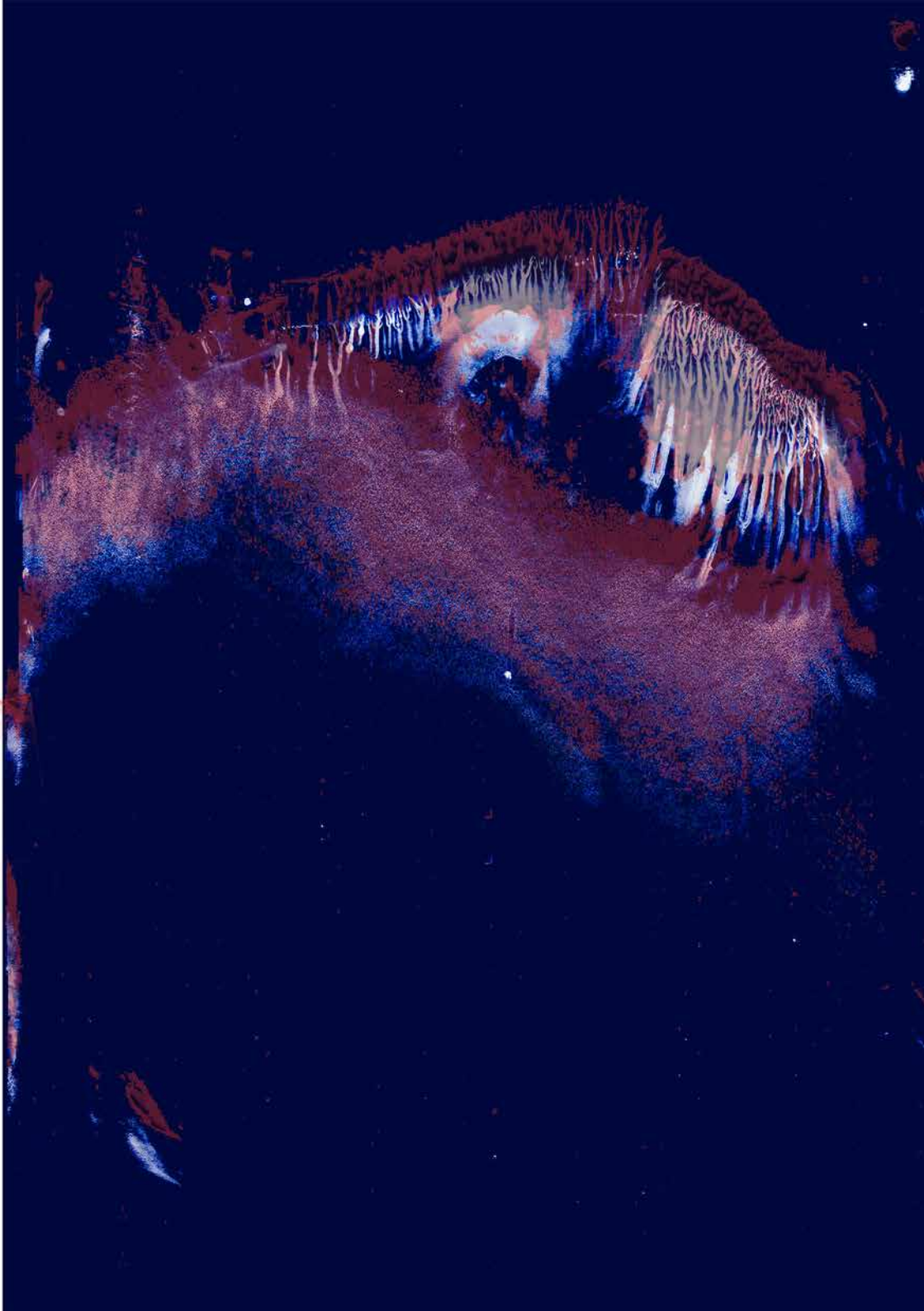








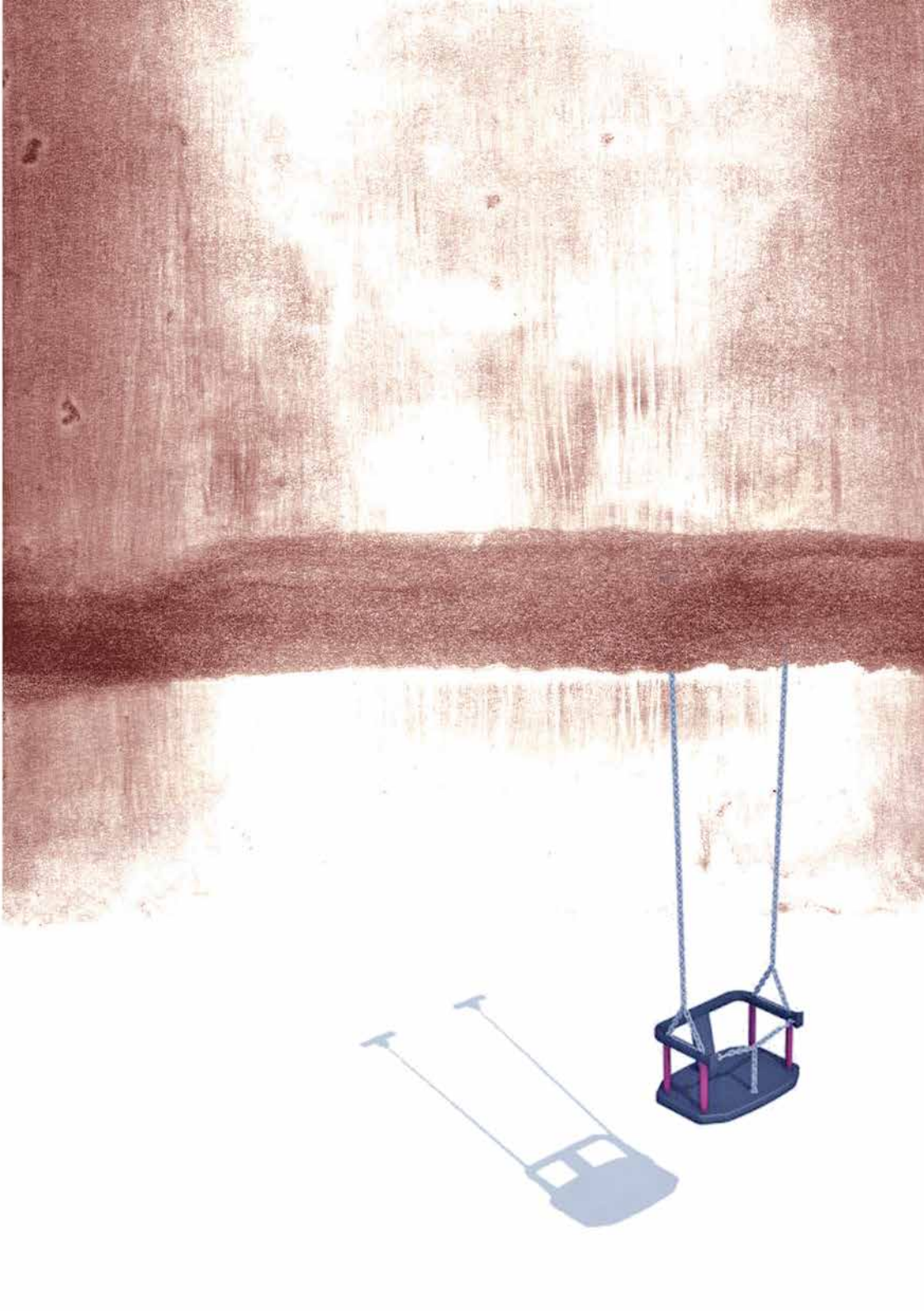


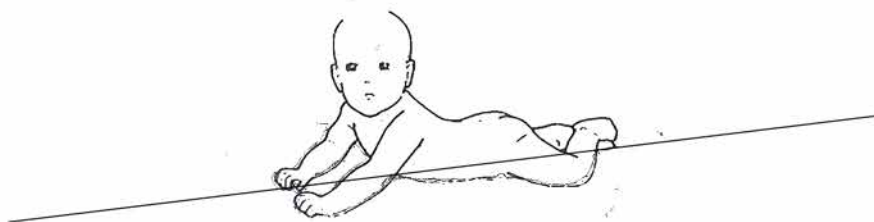


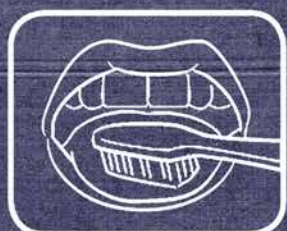
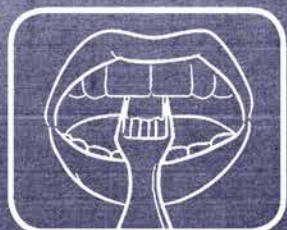
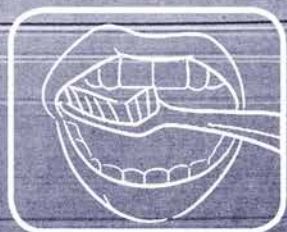
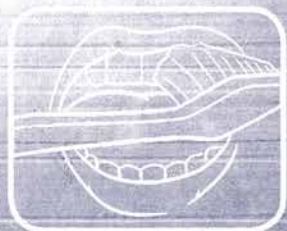


Throughout history, women have fed animal milk to babies using spouted clay jugs, linen, horns, and pickled cow nipples. Archaeologists have found evidence of infant feeding vessels in gravesites dating back to 4000 BC. Yet, these containers inevitably harbored deadly germs. At the Dublin Foundling Hospital, of ten thousand hand-fed infants between 1775 and 1796, only forty-five survived infancy, an astounding mortality rate of 99.6%.



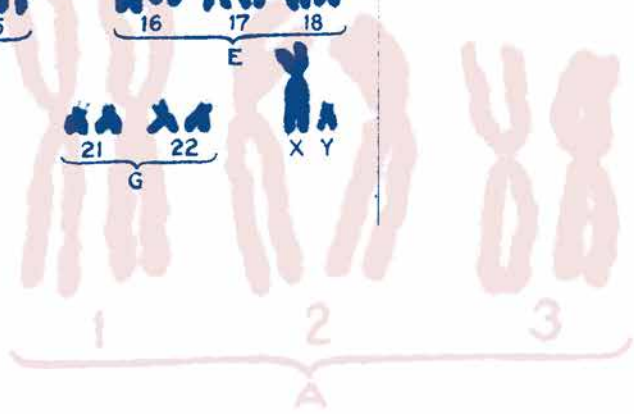
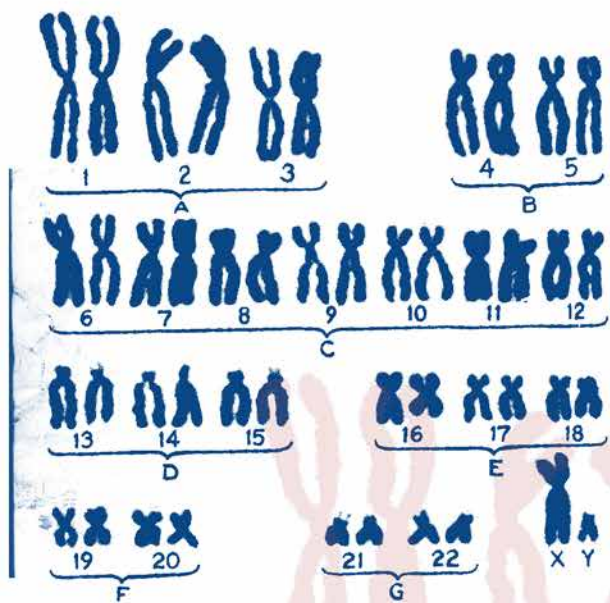




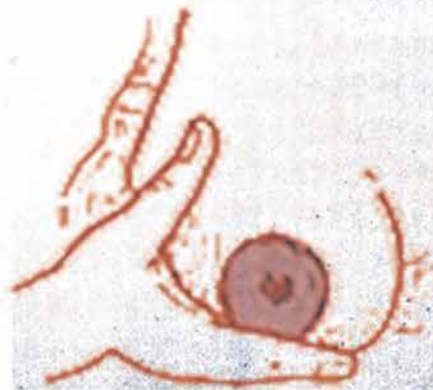
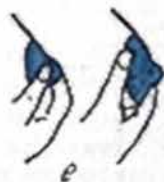
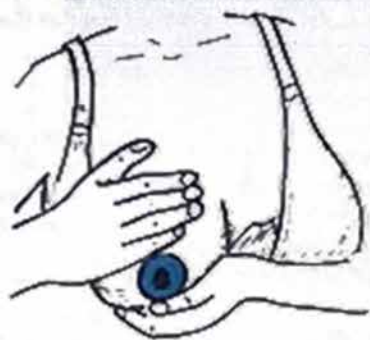
