

# Anarchist Combatant Noms De Guerre

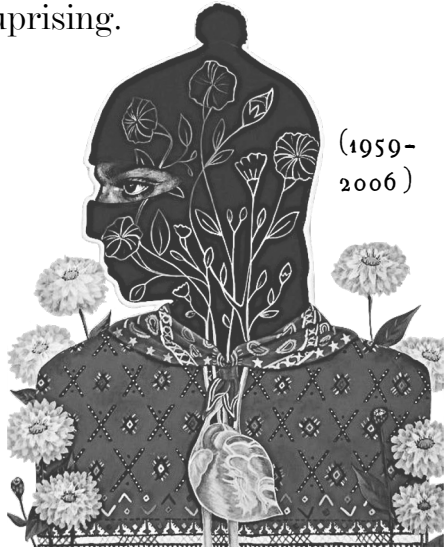


A “nom de guerre” (French for “war name”), is a pseudonym used by combatants while engaged in militant conflict. Using a nom de guerre is useful for hiding one’s identity and for protecting relatives from enemy reprisals. Many combatants of all allegiances have used noms de guerre, but this zine focuses on those used by anarchist assassins and aren’t as common anymore with the need for true anonymity under modern surveillance, but we can seek inspiration from those of us who have taken up arms and fought for what they believed in and who had sick names while they were at it.



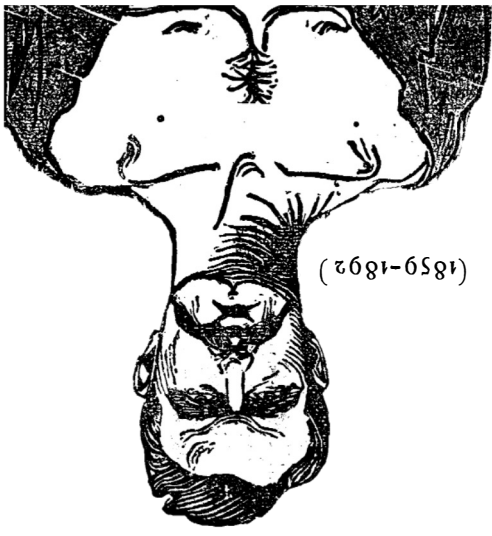
(1851 - 1895)

Nom de Guerre: **Stepniak**  
(‘man of the steppes’)  
Name: **Sergius Kravchinski**  
Russian revolutionary known for assassinating the head of the imperial police street dagger.



(1959 - 2006)

Nom de Guerre: **Comandanta Ramona**  
Name: **Unknown**  
Officer of the Zapatista Army during the 1994 Zapatista uprising.



(1859 - 1892)

Nom de Guerre: **Ravachol**  
Name: **Frangois Koenigstein**  
French anarchist known for bombing judiciaries.



(1898 - 1927)

Nom de Guerre: **Wong Sang**  
Name: **Wong Sau Ying**  
Chinese-Malaysian anarchist known for the attempted assassination of the british high commissioner of Malaysia and of Chinese protectorate officials.



(1885 - 1906)

Nom de Guerre: **Striga**  
Name: **Vladimir Lapidus**  
An illegelist and bomb thrower know for a number of bombings during the Russian revolution of 1905.



(1885 - 1919)

Nom de Guerre: **Marusya**  
Name: **Maria Nikiforova**  
Known as the Ukrainian ‘Joan of Ark’ she was a legendary anarchist combatant in the Russian revolutions.
